### Secretary's Report

We started the cricket season with a BANG! By having the season launch, past player's day and Round 1 game all together in our new pavilion at Lord Reserve. It was a great way to welcome everyone back to the club and also to welcome new players and supporters to the new facilities.

The start of cricket season always brings a few headaches for us to solve, particularly around player availability as it coincides with the Spring Racing carnival, which quite a few members are interested in attending. Also a major factor is the weather in Melbourne, as we are well and truly in Spring, and we know from past experience that the weather patterns during September-December period are particularly changeable. While round cancellations this year were few - I think I recall only one due to unplayable grounds - we certainly played through some cold, wet and windy Saturdays early in the season.

We have improved our player numbers in season 2023/24 and this has helped minimise the number of forfeits we gave in the lowest grade, however, we still had a few games forfeited where not enough players were available to fill four senior teams, despite the best effort of captains, presidents and secretaries to get enough players (only 44!) to agree to play on a Saturday afternoon. I really think this is our achilles heel in the lower two grades, and we must implore our playing members to commit to playing in the early part of the season, in particular, to avoid these forfeits.

On the juniors front, Glenn Gallagher has again been coach of his U12 team to improve their cricket skills as they progress through the junior ranks, with this year's team competing in the U12C competition. There are a number of younger players in the team who are developing their skills quite nicely and being well supported by their teammates, coach and parents. A few wins in the season really encouraged the boys a lot and I'm sure we will see even more success on-field as they develop further.

On an organisational front, the club has needed to step up a level to accommodate the larger facilities, and the expectations around having more food choices available for the more diverse dietary requirements we must cater for. No surprise now to see samosas and vegetarian choices alongside of sandwiches and pies and sausage rolls available from the canteen.

Special thanks to our good friend and past player, Bryan Meneaud (HeavyB) who has again worked tirelessly in the canteen and bar for the season.



### Qualification

### **Batting**

150 runs and 4 innings in a team

If nobody qualifies with runs as per above, then the person who made the most runs in that team, min. number of innings remains (AQ rule). (Committee discretion)

### **Bowling**

15 wickets and a minimum number of overs or bowling spells (committee discretion)
If nobody takes 15 then the person who has taken the most wickets (committee discretion again)

### **Fielding**

3,2,1 voting system each game. Where votes have not been given on a weekly basis, committee discretion applies

#### **MVP**

10 votes split between multiple players each game. Maximum 5 votes per player per game. Not all 10 votes need to be given.
