President's Report

We look back on the 2022/23 season with mixed emotions. It was another challenging season off field, with our rooms still not completed, meaning we had another year in the portables with no social rooms and unable to host club functions. Despite this, there were a lot of positives, and it was great to see improvement from many players across our group, as well as some new faces joining the club.

On field, we achieved mixed results, our First XI found themselves competitive in most games they played, however, ultimately, they were not able to win enough. The team were well led by skipper Tom Cameron, our best performed bat, and the evergreen(grey?) Glenn Gallagher. Noombie was our most reliable and effective bowler in a season where our attack was under pressure for long periods of time. A hard fought 5 wicket haul in the last round capped off his season well.

Our Second XI had some great performances and recorded strong wins against some of the better teams in the grade, however, struggled for consistency and eventually fell short in their bid to make finals. With further development in some of the youngsters and the core remaining strong, I have no doubt they will push for finals next year and have the players to feature strongly. Prakash Kasireddy was again the best performed batsman and is quite capable of stepping into the First XI and having a serious impact. We had an even spread of wicket takers, with Mohan Kolli leading the way and RJ a reliable performer once again.

Our Third XI side, led by new captain Big Sexy, were a good performer throughout the season and occupied a spot in the top 4 for much of the season. It was disappointing to see numbers drop towards the end of the season with finals beckoning, and we hope the guys suit up for next season and push to not only play, but to win finals. We know there is the quality in the team to be a real contender. Lachie McCracken had a superb season, averaging a touch under 40 opening the batting, while chipping in with 8 handy wickets and some time behind the stumps with the gloves. Ravi Kumar also performed strongly, while experienced duo Nutta and Kempy played well when in the team.

Our Fourths, with Zacky High in charge, flew out of the blocks and were sitting pretty at the halfway mark of the season. In the second half of the season, we battled to put four teams on the park at times and the 4ths suffered from this, which meant their finals bid ultimately ran out of steam. Nutta was the best bat, amassing 135 in limited innings at the ridiculous average of 135. While Mick McMahon also posted a superb average of 118. There were a number of good individual performances during the year with Zack High, Shauny T, Vishal Arora, Tim Wills and Christian McMahon all playing match winning knocks. Mick Mac and young Ryan McSwain were the best two bowlers, while it was pleasing to see improvement in young Coco, Harkishan Singh.

From here, the only way is up. I am looking forward to seeing many faces at pre-season training and building as a group to round one and posting great results across the board in 2023/24.

I want to congratulate all the award winners from 2022/23 particularly Tom Cameron & Glenn Gallagher, who tied for the Ward Medal and Ian Nash, awarded Best Clubman (again), for his outstanding contribution across the season.

Peter Kemp also played a significant role in progressing the building of the club rooms, displaying an abundance of patience and influence.

Despite not having club rooms, we were able to hold a couple of functions. It was great to have our Annual Golf day back after a covid hiatus and that was a great day on the course and a ripper evening back at RJ's OC Public Bar in Murrumbeena.

Our biggest event, the Annual \$1,000 Draw, was a roaring success with a fantastic turn out and a great day enjoyed by all. It also raised some much-needed funds for the club and with our rooms back next we hope to make it bigger than ever!

Treasurer's Report

A very difficult season to raise funds for the club due to not having any facilities to run social functions, after-training events, post-match reviews etc.

Nevertheless, the club managed to make a small profit for the season to keep our finances in good shape moving forward.

A number of significant expenditure items in readiness for our new clubrooms. This included new honour boards and electrical cabling for the A/V systems. Negotiations are in train with the soccer club to assist with the outstanding items such as the large TV and audio speakers, which are yet to be purchased.

- 4 Ball cost increased substantially as not so much stock in hand carried forward
- 5 Trophies cost is actually for 2 seasons with over \$1000 carried forward
- 6 New honour boards this season
- 7 Clubroom costs include A/V cabling, last year included dishwasher and a marquee
- 8 Presentation night at the Servery was very different to last year at the Glasshouse and included a bar tab

15 wickets and a minimum number of overs or bowling spells (committee discretion)
If nobody takes 15 then the person who has taken the most wickets (committee discretion again)

Fielding

3,2,1 voting system each game. Where votes have not been given on a weekly basis, committee discretion applies

MVP

10 votes split between multiple players each game. Maximum 5 votes per player per game. Not all 10 votes need to be given.


