A terrific start saw us have Elwood 2-6 with Noombie getting both wickets LBW courtesy of retiring umpire Frank 'Trigger' Robinson.

Elwood got on top of us after that and we struggled to bowl a consistent length to build pressure on them. Their captain batted very well after a shaky start and he found a couple of willing helpers to create a couple of damaging partnerships. At one stage it looked like we'd be chasing 350 but we fought back well late in the day to have them 9-291.

A tough chase we needed to start well but young opener Simon Kulikov was run out without scoring. Kevin Pereira looked good for 15 and David Norris batted well for his 37 before he was triggered by Robbo's replacement.

Daniel Black played shots all around the wicket and with good support from Carl Schleiger we were in a great position at 4-155 with one ball to go to tea when disaster struck with Polly's dismissal.

Chicken kept going after the break and despite losing 3 more partners he went on to make a brilliant 118.

Unfortunately we still needed 60 to win after his dismissal and despite some lusty late order hitting from Mark McSwain we fell 34 short of the target.

Positives from the game include Glenn Gallagher's bowling, 3-38 from 20 overs, a magnificent effort in the conditions, David Norris, Daniel Black and Carl Schleiger's batting and our ground fielding and commitment in the field which was good.

Our other bowlers need to work on bowling a more consistent length and we had too many non contributors with the bat.

We batted 9 overs less than our opponents, if we can bat for 72 overs we will win games, starting with Hampton Central next week.

As the season started for the 2nd XI down at the bright and sunny Elwood cricket club, things were looking up for the team with the recruitment of left arm opener "Sunny" Sanjeev and speedy outswinger Nick Barda. After promising pre seasons, Nick Hulston and Dom Cerreto were looking to cememt their spots while the inclusion of the injury prone Scott Adams and Andrew Miles was an encouraging sign.

Winning the toss, A Miles and H Nicholson took to the middle to face a young but spirited Elwood attack.

Both departed shortly after where new comer Lachie Briody and A Hulston looked to settle proceedings. Both players seem to get themselves "in" before a top order batting collapse saw us 5/47. Some consolidation was required which both D Cerreto and L Adams provided. We built a strong partnership of 63 runs before L Adams departed for 28 and D Cerreto departed not long after for an impressive and powerful 36. Young guns N Barda and N Hulston then combined and with some very hard running and confident strokeplay, took the score to 157. We were all out for a low but still competitive total of 163. Having 2 overs to bowl we fancied out chances at picking up a quick wicket or 2. Our bowlers created these chances however we weren't quite able to convert. This left Elwood 0/10 with next week to play.

Losing Sunny overnight meant we were short an opening bowler with M Hulston coming to sub field for the side. L Briody stepped up to the mark in his replacement and provided a more than serviceable return. Lachie picked up 2/17 with a sharp catch at 2nd slip and a beautiful bowled. The other end saw S Adams make his long awaited return. He also picked up quick wickets with a sharp catch taken at gully and a trademark middle stump bowled. At 4/28, we really had Elwood on the ropes. The Elwood middle order provided some resistance, however still offering regular chances. Unfortunately we couldn't take these chances and Elwood went on to win, 7 wickets down. Fantastic bowling efforts from N Barda 1/29 (11) and N Hulston 1/30 (10) and with the smell of victory so close, we wont let these chances slip in the future.
